I believe we have a golden opportunity to make significant strides forward but I ask you all to be patient, let the ideas have time to work and support the officers as we all have the best interests of the club at heartand please get involved - we can't do it without you.

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AGM Report

After the main standard business of the meeting was done, the new officers outlined the 2005 Action Plan taken from the Development Plan revealed at last years AGM as the targets for the year. The plan was presented on PowerPoint and it was pleasing to see that most people stayed a wake for the whole show with some interesting debates breaking out. The details of the plan will be (if not already) made available on the website so you can take a copy and keep or throw darts at if you feel so inclined. The details were printed in last month's newsletter.

The plan encompasses the whole sphere of operations with the main goal to improve the facilities and make the whole sailing experience better through good management. To improve facilities we will need funding and inevitably this will require a larger membership, this will be achieved with better facilities but prior to this we need to make our racing attractive to new members from other clubs and beginners new to the sport.

Three resolutions were presented to the assembled group;

The constitutional changes proposed included changing the status of full time students for the purposes of membership fees and deleting references to no sailing members. The main item proposed was the change to the club financial year to finish at the end of August allowing the AGM to take place in early November. The general idea of this change is to allow the new committee and officers to be proposed towards the end of the season when the club is still active and dialogue can take place between members on the issues for the following year. The AGM is the time when elections take place allowing the new team to prepare for the new season during the winter months with a much greater period to plan than the current arrangement allows. The constitutional changes were accepted.

An increase of 10% on all membership fees to fund some of the new initiatives in the plan where proposed by the committee. It was pointed out that these increases only go some way towards funding new initiatives and reserves would drop this year unless other funding came available during the year. After debate it was suggested that this increase could be higher and John Daniels tabled an amendment to make a larger increase on the basis that these fees still represent excellent value accepting that our facilities are somewhat below par currently. The amendment proposed a family membership fee of £60; £20 for Seniors with Juniors unchanged and would go further to assist with the funding requirements. The amendment was accepted with a large majority.

The final vote was taken as a means of seeking approval for the printing of the membership list in the new Yearbook. The intention is to provide the means by which members can freely communicate for the purpose of ensuring that OOD duties can be swapped and checked on a weekly basis. It is hoped that using this list, members will check with each other to ensure that everyone rostered on a given day will be present. Email addresses and telephone numbers will only be printed and members will be asked permission to use this information on the 2005 membership forms due for release shortly. The motion was accepted.

The full minutes of the meeting will be published on the website within a few weeks.

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Progress on the Action Plan for 2005

In this section we will be providing details on progress made towards the plan throughout the year, giving feedback on what has been achieved.

OD Training

An A team list has been published for the main OD's who can with an Assistant and Rescue Crew running the races provide on the job training for up 5 trainees. It is important that all those rostered on for training attend as the racing management is key to the new format working. It is not difficult to learn and with the information provided should prove the make duties a great deal more interesting and hopefully not a chore.

Safety boat training

Phil Weston and Sean Teadstone will be announcing dates for PB2 training. We need to get a significant number of people through basic training and our own endorsement to ensure the safety of all concerned at the reservoir.

Doris

She has now been pumped out and is being fitted out ready for the new season. Thanks to Ken and Martin for volunteering to sort her out.

Safety boat storage

We have successfully agreed a package of improvements for the provision of safety boat and essential equipment storage at the waters edge with United Utilities. The large blue container will be moved hopefully in February to an area just to left of the sea scouts containers right on the service road. The RIB and Jeanneau with engines installed will be housed in this container along with the club boats equipment. This will get around the problem of rushing around the site picking up equipment and using a suitable car to tow the boats down to the waters edge. Later we shall be extending the slipway to the front of this container to allow the boats to be pulled in and out of the water with a winch (to be sourced) using only limited manpower. The justification of this is to improve safety and make the whole process easier for all concerned.

Race Management Equipment

To simplify the new start a sequence, a portable control unit is being designed which will contain a battery and be charged in the ranger's cabin along with the radios. On arrival at the reservoir keys, timing unit, instruction manual and radios will be collected fully charged. All other equipment will be in the container.

Timing Control Unit

The new timing unit will plug into suitable sockets on Doris and in the hut to drive the horn and lights (if appropriate). The timing unit will provide the clocks for the three starts and a set of control buttons. The only button which will be needed will be the start countdown. A switch will set the number of starts required.

The sequence will then be automatic and the horn will sound without any interaction from the OD. The OD will only need to operate the flags when prompted from the control panel. If lights are used this will also be automatic. All finished will be timed as currently and adjusted using a simple calculation and this will be illustrated simply on the new race results record sheet.

Multiple courses

The sailing committee are working on a new simple to understand manual to describe the start sequences and the new courses based on a small number of shapes which are simply rotated about Doris depending on wind direction. Courses from the hut will also be standardised.

Courses will generally share the same windward and leeward marks but one or two wing marks will be added for the conventional fleet. Juniors may sail a shorter course.

Training

The training committee is working on an updated strategy for 2005 to meet the needs of the Development Plan.

Clubhouse

A cunning strategy is unfoldingwatch this space.

Yearbook

The new Yearbook will be finalised this month and made available for the start of the season with the sailing and social programmes.

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Sailing Secretary's blitz and blobs

We are introducing a new racing format, as you will by now be aware, the main difference is that there will be separate starts for Asymmetric, Conventional and Junior fleets, with the fleets sailing different courses. This is new to Llandegfedd but the norm for the majority of sailing clubs throughout the UK, just have a look at the programmes on club websites, to check. Those of you who prefer the melee of a mass start, will have the chance on Wednesday evenings. The first race on Sunday will be a 45 minute Pursuit as last year.

We are hoping that sailors, will take the opportunity to benefit from the OOD training that is in place, the aim is that members who need help will be able to gain experience, by assisting some of the clubs more capable OOD's. Thank you to the OOD's who have agreed to help with this initiative. Phil Weston has spent a good deal of time, between nappy changing and feeding baby Ben, to arrange suitable teams, so please make his efforts worthwhile. When you are rostered for race officer duty, make sure you come prepared to go on the water, on most Sundays we will be using Doris, last year we had teams turn up without any wet kit, leaving them vulnerable in any emergency. I am looking for volunteers, for OOD and Safety Boat, who are interested in gaining experience at the next level, by helping at the Open Meetings, I am sure anyone participating will find it rewarding. These members will assist the OOD with the running/safety boat duties for the racing, but will also receive training with regard to all aspects of the OOD activity.

Wednesday Night Racing

Both 'B' and 'C' rated members with be rostered to run the racing.

To undertake this training exercise, will require members to carry out more duties than would normally be required of them during the sailing season. However this commitment, in the long term, will improve the standard of club racing.
