The committee's Intentions for 2005

Overall aims

We have decided that we need some definitive aims this year, and they are;

- Improve facilities
- Make things easier to run
- Improve racing standards
- Communicate better
- Involve all members both in decisions and doing

Sailing activities

OD Training

This is essential to ensure that the standard of racing improves do a level where we are considered to be a well organized racing club again and attract new members.

- Assign less-experienced members to well seasoned OD's for on the job training.
- Use of Doris should be considered the norm by end of 2005 season
- Use of the computer for results as a resource for those who wish to use it.
- Develop a manual for Doris and as the basis of training.
- OD training to emphasize the requirements of the course setting for multiple fleets and starts
- Sole use of flags to be encouraged

Safety boat training

Push forward certification of all members with a schedule of who will be asked to be present prior to racing on each Sunday for assessment.

Safety boat storage

Complete waterside storage facilities for safety boats

OD assignment

To ensure OD cover, a procedure is needed to check attendance on every sailing day;

Contact numbers for all assistants with main OD checking that AOD will be present.

Additional numbers on standby to handle absentees and rescue services.

Impress upon membership on the need to have 'an investment' of more OD duties next year to bring up the standard.

Investigate if there is interest from the younger members to do OD and safety boat duty

Multiple courses

It is essential to support Junior and Asymmetric races to encourage new members and retain those we currently have. Races 2 and 3 should therefore have asymmetric, conventional (reaching)/junior starts on the calendar and run regardless of turnout with results collected and put forward as individual club championships.

Timing of separate fleets with proper equipment provided

Open meetings

- This is an ideal method of promoting the club as long as we do it well.
- 2 day meetings for fleets that can make a case based on support.
- Opens for Topper/Laser, Solo, Asymmetric, CYRC
- Encourage participation in local clubs regattas and print them in the calendar and hand book.
- Encourage members to attend Coppet Week as a Llandegfedd family week with an Offshore Trophy.
- Re-introduce the Club Regatta
- Club Open meeting in May to encourage members to get involved with Open events, introduce them to the concepts involved.
- President's weekend will now be two days with an attempt to attract visitors. Split fleet racing to be promoted.
- Nelson Open meeting day.

Training

To be handled as a separate entity by the Senior Instructors and training committee. Appoint a liaison person to help newcomers.

General Admin

Clubhouse

Plan to be put in place for alternative clubhouse as well as lobbying United Utilities and Welsh Water for a user centre.

In addition to the cards currently produced, provide fully concise booklet to include;

- Calendar of sailing activities, social and business dates
- OD procedures
- Full year plan for OD duty

New blood is urgently needed on the committee, as ever! We need a new newsletter Editor this year. Please remember that being on the committee is a good way to get to know people, and to influence the future of the club.

Proposed changes to the Constitution

I nearly got through my term of office without looking at the Club's constitution, but I wanted to propose one change to the Club's practice, and I discovered that the rules must be altered to accommodate it.

In case you are interested, the Rules are on the Website at www.llandegfedd.org.uk (under Admin, Constitution)

Although the sailing year runs from 1st March to 31st October, the Commodore and Committee hold office for one year from the AGM. The Rules say that the AGM must be held in December or January. In reality, most of the planning for the next season is carried out by Christmas.

Therefore, the new officers take their posts after the planning has been done. It makes more sense for the new committee to plan for the year in which it holds office. I therefore propose that the AGM be held in November. I suggest that it should take place early in November, so that the new team can co-ordinate the new season, and the old team can relax.

CHANGE 1 - Rule 32

Permit AGM to be held between November and January

There will be a consequent change, which doesn't require a change in the rules-

• That the financial year will run from 1st September to 31st August in subsequent years. The current financial year (which started on 1st November) will be short. This will allow the accounts to be prepared in time for the AGM.

We also noticed another 2 areas to tidy up-

CHANGE 2 – rule 3 a)

Change in definition of full membership. Adults and *any* children under 19 *or in full time education*.

CHANGE 3 - rule 4

Remove references to "Racing" and "non-Racing" members, replace with "Full" and "Senior" members

OPTIMIST SCHOLARSHIPS

Llandegfedd SC own three racing specification Optimists that were purchased a couple of years ago with a Sportslot grant. These boats are loaned to promising young sailors for a year in the form of a scholarship. All the boats were loaned last season and it would be great to see all three in use in 2005.

Anyone interested should apply in writing to the Commodore and the committee will allocate the boats when they become available.

Before taking delivery of the boat you will be required to pay a loan fee of £100 (non-returnable) for the year and £50 damage deposit. (returnable).

Preference to be given to:

- 1) Juniors showing potential and commitment.
- 2) Those who have complete the club course, or equivalent (Stage 2 minimum).
- 3) Where parental support is forthcoming but provision of a boat is unlikely.
- 4) To those who have not benefited previously.
